Location:	Schools and Community Groups across Liverpool and Sefton
Reports to:	Outreach Leader

OVERALL PURPOSE OF THE ROLE

To 'make a difference together for All animals'.

To support Freshfields Animal Rescue to be pro-active in making a lasting difference to the welfare of domestic and wild animals in the future by helping people young and old to be aware of the issues affecting animals and what they can do to help.

To advocate on behalf of Freshfields Animal Rescue and encourage individuals and groups to support the work of the charity.

The initial focus of the outreach session volunteers will develop content on the topic of rabbits with a view to developing other subject areas in the future.

KEY TASKS

1. To develop and create education packs for school and community group engagement that support early years foundation stage curriculum topics.
2. To deliver two hour workshops on the topics of domestic animals and wildlife in schools and community venues
3. To facilitate workshop activities that are suitable for the participant group.
4. To learn about the animals on which the workshops are focused
5. To learn the workshop aims and objectives and ensure that these are met
6. To gather evidence that the workshop aims and objectives are met
7. To work within current data protection law
8. To implement Freshfields safeguarding and equal opportunities Policies within your role.
9. To provide participant feedback to the Outreach Education Leader.
